

## Free Picks – March 10<sup>th</sup> Weekend

Tim Spears and the guys at ParlayPick.com have been showing why they're considered some of the best, hitting their weekly free parlay recommendation for the second week in a row! This streak has given our readers some GREAT returns, and they're back this week with another strong play.

The Indiana Pacers have been as beaten up as any team in the NBA this season, but there's light at the end of the tunnel, with star guard Jamaal Tinsley back in the lineup after 15 games on the sidelines. The Pacers have been very profitable with the lineup they'll be playing tonight, and are on an 11-4 ATS run right now. They'll take on the Hornets, a team on a 4 game losing streak and a 2-6 SU and ATS run. When Indy beat these guys by 22 back in February, the Hornets were held to under 35% shooting from the field. This is just a case of one team being far better than the other, and we're going with the better team and the wiser choice. **Play Indiana.**

We love the situational matchup presented by the Utah St. Aggies as they have been named the one-point fave against Louisiana Tech. The Aggies have won six of seven, and if they beat the Bulldogs tonight it'll be three times this season. The Bulldogs have had a successful season, but haven't been putting teams away. We're cautious about any team that has shown their lack of heart towards the end of games. Utah State outscored opponents by nearly 8 points a game this year, whereas Louisiana was just 2.5 points ahead on average. In this one though, free throw shooting will make the difference. LA Tech is shooting just 61% over their last five games... not the kind of number you want to bet on. Also, check this out: Utah State? Third in the country in FG%. Louisiana? 261<sup>st</sup>. Utah State? Third in three-point shooting as well. Louisiana? 329<sup>th</sup>. Whoops. **Play Utah St. Aggies.**

This week, we're going to give you more great underdog value on the best team in the NHL. There's no reason to think the Carolina Hurricanes won't beat the Florida Panthers by at least two goals tonight – this team has raced to the league's best record, and is second in goals scored, thanks to the stellar play of stars like Eric Staal. They've played very well against teams in their own division, and that continues tonight. Florida, on the other hand, is rapidly running out of reasons to care – they're going to be missing the playoffs yet again, and at this point, are just playing out the season. Bank on the emotional edge as Carolina looks to wrap up home-ice advantage for the post-season and get the job done. **Play Carolina on the Puckline.**

Our weekly PARLAYPlay has exceeded all expectations, opening with a 2-0 run, with all four incorporated picks hitting in the process. Raps: The Nuggets are playing the second game of back-to-back road games, and after their big win over the Sixers last night, we're predicting a let down against Toronto tonight. The Raptors have been struggling as of late, but they've been keeping games close. Sure, a loss is a loss, but they beat the Celtics, and have lost a number of games by only 1 or 2 points. The Raptors have been rewarding backers all season, at 33-24-4 ATS, while the Nugs are just at .500 on the year. Toronto holds the edge in scoring, FG%, FT%, TOs, and bench production. We're looking for them to defend their home court and take the win against a tired Denver team.

Another great situational play on the Lakers as well: San Antonio has done TERRIBLY against the spread on zero days rest, and that's where they find themselves tonight, just 2-8 ATS when they have had zero days rest and their opponent has had 0, 1, or 2 days rest. Don't get us wrong: San Antonio is the better team here, and they may win the game. But will they have the energy to push for a double digit win one night after beating Phoenix? We doubt it. **Play Los Angeles Lakers and Toronto Raptors.**
